Master List of Pumpkin Varieties

The scientific name of pumpkins is Cucurbita pepo. We've included closely related giant pumpkins (Cucurbita maximima) and winter squashes (Cucurbita moschata) as they often serve interchangeably in cooking and decoration. Pumpkins like a long (60 to 130 days), warm growing climate, ideally 68 F to 90 F (20 C to 32 C); but a hot wet climate makes them susceptible to fungus. Categories of pumpkins

- **Giant pumpkins** are the massive pumpkins you see loaded on trucks to display. Typical contest winners weigh over 1,000 lbs (450 kg)
- **Jack O Lantern pumpkins** are those developed for size and a tall round shape, but their grainy texture and lack of flavor makes them less suitable for cooking. They'll do, but a pie or eating pumpkin
- **Pie pumpkins, eating pumpkins and winter squashes** come in a huge variety of shapes, colors, sizes, textures and flavors.

<p>Autumn Gold</p> 	all-purpose	Bright orange flesh, round basketball size and shape with slight ribbing, which makes it a dual purpose for carving at Halloween and eating.
<p>Baby Bear</p> 	Eating, decor	105 days. All-America Selections winner. Deep orange, 1 ½ - 2 ½ lb fruits are half the size of normal pie pumpkins with flesh that is sweet and moist.. Ave 8 pumpkins per vine. Excellent storage quality. Between a pie and a mini-pumpkin, flattened, medium orange. Good for pies. The seeds have no hulls, they are great to roast.
<p>Baby Boo</p> 	decor	95 day. 2-3 inch diameter deep orange (sometimes white) ribbed fruit. Mini, flattened and ridged. From Pennsylvania, released in 1990. Pretty, as as Halloween decorations or used as a dining centerpiece.
<p>Baby Pam</p> 	all-purpose	105 day. Best quality for pie pumpkin. Bright, deep orange skin and thick tan handle. Average weight is 4lb. 4-5 fruits per plant.
<p>Batwing</p> 	decor	80 days. A small .5-1 lb. pumpkin with many variations, some resembling bat wings, orange dipped in dark green paint look. Some will completely orange, some all dark green, and a good quantity being half orange and half green. Average weight is 1/2 to 1 pound

<p>Big Max</p> 	giant	125 days - Giant squash-type pumpkin (oblong, orange, huge). This variety has been around for many years and the pumpkins usually range from 100 lbs to 300 lbs, Color is range of orange to a pale salmon. Big Max can exceed 20 in (510 mm) in diameter under ideal growing conditions They are often bright orange in color, with fine-grained, yellow-orange flesh.
<p>Blaze</p> 	decor	Pale orange skin with deep orange from their base. This is a popular plant to grow as it is very productive and has excellent resistance to disease.
<p>Blue doll</p> 	eating	A greenish-blue pumpkin that grows from 15 to 20lbs in weight. A deep orange flesh good for pies and soups. Very similar to Jarrahdale.
<p>Blue Hubbard</p> 	eating, Great for pumpkin pies	100 days. An heirloom dating to 1909 by Gregory as Symmes Blue Hubbard. Averages 30 - 40 lbs. Excellent flavor, productivity and storage qualities. It is high in dietary fiber and rich in Vitamin A & C Used in pies, vegetarian stews, cakes, and candies.
<p>Blue Jarrahdale</p> 	eating, decor	110 days. An heirloom pumpkin with pale gray, almost green-blue skin and a stringless, dense, sweet orange flesh.. Some variants look more blue than others. Expect 3 to 5 fruits per plant, each 10 to 14 inch weighing about 6 to 12 pounds each.

 Buckskin	Eating	Large pie size, taller than wide, tapered towards blossom end, tan, with short thin peduncle.
 Butternut Squash	eating - Makes excellent pumpkin pies	105 days. Beige skin, with deep orange, smooth-textured seetw, nutty-tasting flesh that improves with a couple months' storage. Fruits avgerage 9" long and weigh 4 to5 lb. Each plant produces 4 or 5 squash. When ripe, it turns increasingly deep orange, and becomes sweeter and richer. It is a good source of fiber, vitamin C, magnesium, and potassium; and it is a source of vitamin A. Butternut squash can be roasted, sautéed, toasted, puréed for soups such as squash soup, or mashed to be used in casseroles, breads, muffins, and pies. The squash is also used as an alternative diet for Monarch butterfly caterpillars alongside cucumbers.
 Calabaza	eating	Common to the Philippines, West Indies and Puerto Rico, Calabaza squash need a long warm growing season. 
 Carnival	Eating	Mottled green, yellow and orange acorn squash with excellent flavor. Carnival squash is small to medium in size, 12-17 centimeters in diameter. The flesh is firm, dry, coarse, and pale orange in color with a large and fibrous seed cavity with stringy pulp and many flat, beige seeds. Cooked squash is soft and tender with a fragrant aroma and is slightly nutty, buttery, and sweet, similar to butternut squash. Vigorous, semi-bush vines yield a large number of fruits.

Cinderella (a.k.a., Rouge Vif d'Etampes) 	decor, eating	The classic fairytale pumpkin that looks like Cinderella's pumpkin carriage. They stack well, and have deep ribbing with a bright orange-red skin. They also have moist flesh that is great for pies. It is also called Rouge Vif d'Etampes.
Connecticut Field 	all-purpose	A large, all purpose pumpkin, good for carving and pies.

<p>Crystal Star</p> 	decor, carving	<p>100 days. This white pumpkin remains pure white as it ages unlike many other white varieties. A round shaped pumpkin that carves well. Average Weight: 25-35 pounds</p>
<p>Cushaw</p> 	eating, decor	<p>105 Days. Cushaws all have the characteristic bottle shape, but they come in a variety of colors and stripe patterns. 7-25 lb. Good for cooking, but just average for pies. Avg. 2-4 fruits per plant. Bulbous bottom with tapered neck. Full vine</p>
<p>Dickinson Pumpkin</p> 	eating	<p>100 days. Famous for being the main variety that Libbey's uses in its canned pumpkin pie filling. Medium to large beige squash. Average weight 10 to 40 pounds. Roundish elongated shape, 18 inches long by 14 inch diameter.</p>

Dwarf Tiger Striped Pumpkin 	decor	100 days. A mini pumpkin with orange and white stripe. Easy to grow, non-hybrid; you can save the seeds for the next year.
Fairytale 	decor, eating	Medium to large, heavy for size, flattened, heavily ridged, deep tan at maturity. Vigorous vines had white markings on leaves and showed very little powdery mildew.
Flat White Boer Ford 	decor, eating	a flat pumpkin that looks like it has been squashed under a truck! Wider than it is tall and an asymmetrical shape. They keep well, have a very small seed cavity and dense flesh
Futsu Black 	eating	105 days. This very deep green ribbed and warted squash appears to be almost black. The golden orange flesh is delicious with a strong taste similar to hazelnuts. Fruits are large with weights close to 10 pounds a possibility. An excellent storage variety. Flavor develops in storage. Black Futsu is an heirloom Japanese pumpkin. Great roasted, fried in tempura, pureed in pies or soups, or pickled! 3-5 fruits per plant, averaging 3 lbs. each.

 <p>Howden</p>	carving	115 Days. Standard jack-o-lantern, developed by John Howden of Massachusetts in the early 1970. Modern hybrids are likely better in any and all regards (disease resistance, yield, etc.) It is round, slightly taller than wide, dark orange, with average peduncle. Average weight 18 to 26 lb. or larger. Avg. yield: 1-2 fruits per plant.

Kakai is a variety of the Austrian type that yields the valuable green pumpkin seed oil that some European studies show promotes prostate health. Semi-bush, short-vine plants. Avg. yield: 2-3 fruits/plant. After displaying the (un-carved) pumpkins next fall, you can scoop out the large, dark green, completely hull-less seeds, which are delicious roasted.

The flesh is a golden hue with a fine flavor. The skin color is a variegated green and orange although some fruit will be entirely orange and others entirely green. 

 <p>Munchkin</p>	decor	100 days. Munchkin is only 3 to 4" wide and has a bright orange color with deep sutures. On the downside, Munchkin is more susceptible to Mosaic viruses than other pumpkin varieties. Average Weight: 4-8 ounces
 <p>Mystic</p>	eating, decor	105 days. Deep orange small pie pumpkin 8" wide x 6" tall average weight 7-8 lbs. Sweet flesh. Large, sturdy handles, strongly attached. Plants have medium resistance to powdery mildew. e.
 <p>Neck</p>	eating Heirloom, great for pies	120 days. Neck, sometimes called "crockneck pumpkin" is a relative of butternut types. It has sweet tasting, very smooth, stringless, bright orange flesh.
